### The Feast of the Holy Name

This year the Feast of the Holy Name falls on Sunday January 1, 2017. The Feast of the Holy Name observing the naming and circumcision of Jesus Christ on the eighth day of his life. It is a time to honor the revelation of Jesus' name by dream to Joseph, and likewise the revelation of the same to Mary by the Archangel Gabriel at the Annunciation.

Under the Law of Moses, all male infants were to be circumcised on the eighth day after birth. It was also customary at this time for family and friends to witness the naming of the child. He was called Jesus.

The designation of the feast in Jesus' Holy Name is new to the 1979 Book of Common Prayer.it was traditionally celebrated as the Feast of the Circumcision. Celebration of the Holy Name reflects the significance of the Holy Name of Jesus, and the emphasis of the Gospel of Luke on the naming of Jesus rather than the circumcision.

The Feast of the Holy Name originated toward the end of the 15<sup>th</sup> century, celebrated between New Year's Day and Epiphany. In its older incarnations, the Feast was a celebration of Christ's naming and circumcision, and thus a memoriam of the first shedding of the Lord's blood. In its modern form, it is considered to be the central feast of all the mysteries of Jesus Christ.

## Season of Christmas "THE 12 DAYS OF CHRISTMAS"

On the **First** day of Christmas my true love gave to me...A Partridge in a Pear Tree.

The Partridge is Jesus,

The Pear tree is the cross through which we are saved.

On the **Second** day of Christmas my true love gave to me...Two Turtle Doves.

The two Turtle Doves are in reference to the Old and New Testaments.

On the **Third** day of Christmas my true love gave to me...Three French Hens.

The three French Hens are faith, hope and love. Some people feel they may symbolize the three Wise Men.

On the **Fourth** day of Christmas my true love gave to me...Four Calling Birds.

The four Calling birds are the four Gospels; Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

On the **Fifth** day of Christmas my true love gave to me...Five Golden Rings.

The Five Golden Rings recall the Torah (law); the first five books of the Old Testament: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy.

On the **Sixth** day of Christmas my true love gave to me...Six Geese-A-Laying.

The six Geese-a-laying is in reference to the six days of creation.

On the **Seventh** day of Christmas my true love gave to me...Seven swans-a-swimming.

The seven swans-a-swimming stand for the seven Sacraments;

The Sacraments are "An outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace"

Holy Baptism-born into God's family Holy Eucharist-central Act of Worship Confirmation-gift of the Holy Spirit is renewed and the person confirmed and strengthened by God with the laying on of hands

Ordination-Deacons, Priest and Bishops Holy Matrimony-lifelong union of husband and wife

Reconciliation-confession and forgiveness to God in the presence of a Priest or Bishop

Holy Unction-special blessing of those who are ill with blessed oil.

On the **Eighth** day of Christmas my true love gave to me...Eight maids-a-milking.

The eight maids-a-milking are the Eight Beatitudes;

The Beatitudes are a map of life. They guide, they point, and they teach the values of Christ.

On the **Eleventh** day of Christmas my true love gave to me...Eleven Pipers Piping.

The eleven Pipers piping stand for the eleven faithful Disciples.

Simon Peter, James, John , Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Thaddaeus, Thomas, Matthew Simon, James the brother of John

On the **Twelfth** day of Christmas my true love gave to me...Twelve Drummers Drumming.

The twelve drummers drumming symbolize the 12 Points of belief of the Apostles Creed.

And in Jesus Christ, his only begotten Son, our Lord,

Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary,

Suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead and buried; He descended into hell.

The Feast of Epiphany, one of seven principal feasts, is celebrated on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of January. Most years we have celebrated the Epiphany the Sunday following; however, this year we will be celebrating Epiphany on Friday January 6, 2017 at 6:30 pm with the Holy Eucharist and a celebration following in the parish house.

The Three big events we remember in Epiphany are:

The visit of the wise men bringing gifts to the Christ child, who by so doing "reveal" Jesus to the world as Lord and King.

The flight of Mary & Joseph with baby Jesus to Egypt to escape the threat of Jesus' young life from King Herod.

Jesus' baptism by John in the river Jordan revealed his divinity as the Son of God.
